A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Church Family:

It is with great affection for you and distress because of my physical situation that I write this letter. About two months ago during a routine blood analysis, it was discovered that my white blood cells, red blood cells, and platelets were significantly below normal. It now appears that they are not going back to normal quickly. Because of this I am at a high risk of developing infectious diseases. My physician, Dr. Jia Bi, Board Certified in Hematology and Oncology, has advised me to avoid all hospitals, nursing homes, sick persons, and crowds until the source of the problem is identified and treated.

Therefore, I have met with Eliot Hinson, chairman of Deacons, to arrange to take a sick leave for the 60 days provided in the Church’s Constitution and By-laws. Hopefully, by that time, because of God’s grace and your prayers and mine, I will be as good as new or at least on the road to recovery. Please know that I am available to you by telephone, 790 - 8396.

It is going to be difficult for me not to worship with you and be a “hands on” part of our church which I have loved since the 1980’s when I was Interim Pastor. In the meantime, Brian and I will be in communications. Eliot, Brian, and the deacons will be responsible for the work of the church. Call on them as your needs arise and keep them aware of the needs of others within the congregation. I look forward to worshipping with you real soon.

One benefit of using your newsletter as a promotional tool is that you can reuse content from other marketing materials, such as press releases, market studies, and reports.

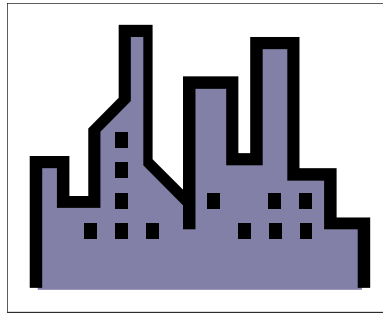
While your main goal of distributing a newsletter might be to sell your product or service, the key to a successful newsletter is making it useful to your readers.

You can also research articles or find "filler" articles by accessing the World Wide Web. You can write about a variety of topics but try to keep your articles short.

Much of the content you put in your newsletter can also be used for your Web site. Microsoft Publisher offers a simple way to convert your newsletter to a Web publication. So, when you're finished writing your newsletter, convert it to a Web site and post it.

INSIDE STORY HEADLINE

This story can fit 100-150 words.

The subject matter that appears in newsletters is virtually endless. You can include stories that focus on current technologies or innovations in your field.

You may also want to note business or economic trends, or make predictions for your

customers or clients.

If the newsletter is distributed internally, you might comment upon new procedures or improvements to the business. Sales figures or earnings will show how your business is growing.

Some newsletters include a column that is updated every issue, for instance, an advice

column, a book review, a letter from the president, or an editorial. You can also profile new employees or top customers or vendors.

"To catch the reader's attention, place an interesting sentence or quote from the story here."

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This story can fit 75-125 words.

Selecting pictures or graphics is an important part of adding content to your newsletter.

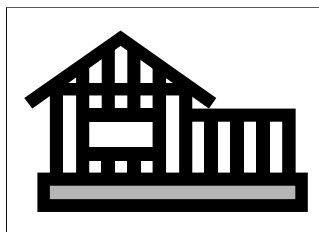
Think about your article and ask yourself if the picture supports or enhances the message you're trying to convey. Avoid selecting images that appear to be out of context.

Microsoft Publisher includes

thousands of clip art images from which you can choose and import into your newsletter.

There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.

Once you have chosen an image, place it close to the article. Be sure to place the



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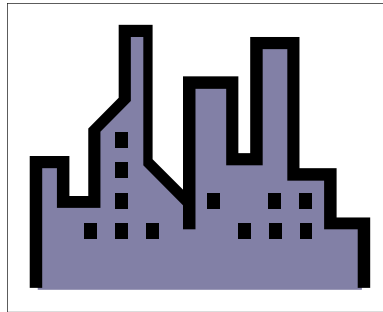
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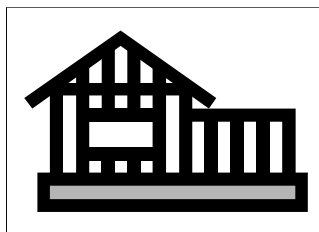
